Back in the Groove from the director

Something's shifted at the Custom House. There are new docents at the desk, volunteers stepping forward, school groups from elementary to college-level taking the tour, browsers in the Shop. We've got our pre-COVID groove back!

This is after a summer one could only call peculiar. It was as if we existed in a suspended state -- working hard, but behind-the-scenes -- developing plans, writing grant proposals, sorting piles of files. Construction preliminaries at our two off-shore lighthouses meant tours to both Race Rock and Ledge were paused for the season -- a disappointment all-round. Maintnance at the museum was put off, too, as we work towards the ultimate goal of replacing of the roof.

At the Custom House the *Briney Bank Border* -- a garden alongside the museum -- baked to a crisp, while I worked from home much of the summer following a surgery. In truth, my absence was not all-bad. Our docents stepped forward and ran the day-to-day show with fantastic success! We have a super capable team -- friendly, funny, lovers-of-history all!

Now the season has turned and summer's plans are bearing fruit. A new cedar gate constructed by Arrow Fence was installed at the entrance to **Harbor Pequot Lighthouse**. This gate, a lighthouse brochure, and bronze entrance sign are all thanks to a gift from a steady supporter of NLMS, **Louise Novitch**. In September, an anonymous lighthouse lover sponsored **ServPro of New London** for six hours of intensive cleaning at **Race Rock** -- something we haven't been able to do since receiving the light ten years ago. The rusting railing at Race was measured; we hope to have a replacement constructed on-shore this winter and installed in 2025. And after decades of deferred maintenance, some serious restoration work has commenced at **Ledge Lighthouse**. There's a cost overrun with no time to spare, so we've established a **Go Fund Me** campaign to garner support.Please help!

This fall we celebrated Lafayette (in song!) on the 100th anniversary of his return to the US. Author Winsome Bingham and historian Manisha Sinha both spoke out about the importance of voting. We were proud to host them. It is our 16th year presenting Local History & Landmarks to New London's third graders. There's Jibboom, Open Mic, and lots more music. Our 2024 Annual Meeting takes place Saturday, December 7, followed by a new tradition: Tubas at the Custom House -- A Holiday Singalong, which was so much fun last year. Harbor Light tours continue year-round. Tickets still just \$5 for New Londoners.

The life of a museum worker is essentially one of service. The NLMS trustees, docents, volunteers and I are here for you, and wish you all *Happy Holidays*.

Support Urgent Repairs for Ledge Lighthouse!

Iconic landmark, New London Ledge Lighthouse, is getting some long-overdue attention. Initial work on getting some long-overdue attention. Initial work of Ledge Lighthouse began in October, funded with grants obtained by the Ledge Light Foundation. Having opened up one wall, it appears the condi-tions are a bit more serious than initially thought. Built in 1909, the structure's interior steel beams have rusted, the expanded metal pushing against the bricks, causing cracks in the exterior that are letting water in! We must replace the rusted iron beam and fix the worst exterior cracks. But because the damage is so serious, the costs now are estimated to run \$25,000 over budget. Additional repairs must be made right now while the wall is open.


